The entrance exam for **programmes in** physical education or coaching consists of knowledge tests, but also testing candidate's abilities in multiple sports disciplines like swimming, track and field, gymnastics, ball games (football, basketball, volleyball, handball) and dance. Most of the institutions offer preparatory courses in the months before entrance exams. Programmes in physical education and coaching usually include outdoor lessons and even some travelling (to ski resorts or the seaside) in order to ensure different sport experiences for future sports teachers and coaches.



...how to manage a team, how athletes' motivation work, how to run sports business

There are also **other sports programmes** that do not prepare candidates to work directly with children or adults on developing their physical abilities (like sports managements or sports psychology). Entrance exams for these programmes do not have sports ability tests, but only written or oral knowledge exams. During studies of sports management or sport psychology it is common to have an internship in a sports related institution or organization.





...how to organize sport activities, write about sports or just certify what you already know

Short professional development courses for sport professionals enable people who already work in sport to obtain recognised certification of their skills. Examples of these short professional development courses include courses for sport instructors, sports/tourist animators, operational coaches, sports guides, sport journalist, etc.
